surveyed the M/S "INTERPRETER" 6815 gross tons of Liverpool on June 30, 1967 whilst the vessel lay afloat at Long Beach Terminal, Houston, Texas for temporary repairs to the starboard side shell plating, No. 1 plate from forward in 4th strake below sheer,

and that I am transmitting to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a report, stating that all temporary repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, also that I am recommending that she be continued as now classed without fresh record of survey, subject to wasted area of starboard side shell plate No. 1 from forward in 4th strake below sheer, in way of the 16'-0" draught mark, being specially examined and dealt with as found necessary at next dry docking, and to any conditions attached to the vessel's class being dealt with as previously recommended.
