It is understood from Messrs. Lambert Brothers Limited, the London Representatives of prospective purchasers of the above-named vessel, that she is to be placed in Drydock at your Port early next week.

The Buyers have requested that a General Examination be carried out now with a view to the postponement of the Special Survey until April 1964, but it has been explained to Messrs. Lambert Brothers that it is customary for a General Examination to be held about the due date and not five months before the survey falls due.

It has been suggested to them that, with the consent of the present Owners, you make such an examination of the bottom while the ship is in Drydock bearing in mind the fact that she may not be again docked until April 1964. Provided this is done, the Committee will doubtless agree to a General Examination being held afloat about next April with a view to the full year of grace being granted. Alternatively of course a General Examination can be held now with a view to the postponement of the Special Survey until December 1963. I shall be obliged if you will kindly bear the above points in mind when carrying out your inspection, although it must be appreciated that the ship is not yet being taken over by the new Owners.
