


Motorship "KING DAVID"

Mr. Jewel of Lambert Brothers Ltd., has telephoned that this vessel is to be drydocked at Newcastle on Monday next and that the prospective purchasers desire a General Examination then to be held with a view to the postponement of the Special Survey which will fall due next April until April 1964.

It has been explained to Mr. Jewel that it is not customary for the Committee to authorise a General Examination to be held five months before a Special Survey falls due; but it has been suggested that with the consent of the present Owners the Newcastle Surveyors may make an examination of the vessel while in drydock, and to bear in mind the fact that the ship may not be again drydocked until April 1964.

If this is done the Committee will doubtless be agreeable to a General Examination being held afloat at about the due date next April with a view to the full year of grace being granted.

Mr. Jewel would like us to inform the Newcastle Surveyors of the position.
