In reply to your letter of the 5<sup>th</sup> instant regarding the case of the S.S. "Holme Wood" (late Seal Force) I beg leave to advise you that this vessel appears to be still laid up at Messrs. Williamson's Shipway at Workington, pending the decision of the Owners. Messrs. R. Williamson & Son to remove her to Glasgow to have a new main boiler fitted and the survey on Hull & Machinery completed.

So far as this Office is concerned I would state that we have completed our work of survey upon the machinery, and our report was sent to Mr. House, to be forwarded by you with his own report upon the Hull, which we anticipated would also be completed about that time.
