Gentlemen,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 30th ultimo and telegram and letter of yesterday's date respecting the donkey boiler taken from the steamer "CEYLON" which is proposed to be fitted on board the steamer "DERVENT" (No.282 in the Register Book), and with regard to the proposal to fit the steam dome taken off the original boiler on to the boiler now being placed on board I have to acquaint you, in confirmation of my telegram as below, that this steam chest will be approved for a working pressure of 90 lbs per square inch, but that the safety valves must not be adjusted to a greater pressure than that allowed by the Rules for the present sizes of cylinders and shafting.

The sketch forwarded by you is returned herewith, and I also enclose for your information and guidance in dealing with the case Leith report No.12188 of survey recently held on the boiler removed from the "CEYLON" together with the first entry report on that boiler.
