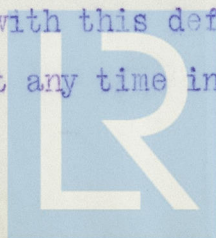

Confirming our wire of date, we are instructed by the "Atlantide" Società di Navigazione, of GENOA, who have entered into a contract for the purchase of the above steamer, to appeal against your second surveyor's recommendation in the matter of the defect in this steamer's stern frame.

When your surveyors at BARRY saw the stern frame after the shoe plate covering the defect was removed, they said the defect would have to be dealt with, but your second surveyor's recommendation is that a shoe plate be again replaced, covering the defect.


The result of this is that the ship remains with this defect, and not a permanent repair effected, and the purchasers are expected to take over a steamer with this defect hanging over her, which they may be called upon at any time in the future to repair.
