

We hereby certify that we have supplied the
 Brig Spray Capt. Paul of Greenock belonging to
 Messrs Kerr & McBride here with Chains and Anchors as under
 noted, that the Chain Cables have been subjected to proof strains
 as follow, viz.

The $1\frac{1}{8}$ inch Chain to a strain of 26 Tons, the $1\frac{1}{8}$ inch Chain to a
 strain of 26 Tons, and the $\frac{3}{4}$ inch Chain to a strain of 10 Tons; and
 that on the last link of each fifteen fathoms the proof strain is
 marked as per margin.
