REPAIRS At Present Shipped the Yellow Metal Sheathing and Cleaned the Bottom, Grown out and renewed all the Iron Bolts in the Hold Beam Lodging knees and throat Bolts to the Hanging knees, Stringers and Shelf Bolts and the Greater portion of the Greenails from the Bilges to the Wales and some in the Flat of the Bottom with British Oak and Greenheart, A new False Keel, Repasted the Ceiling in the Hold with 3/8 inch Iron Pump Bolts, Caulked from the Keel to the Gunwale, Vinber Heads & Waterways and Resheathed the Bottom with Yellow Metal over Paper below and Felt above
