Nature of Survey

Damage stranding

The Lloyd's Agent at Algiers forwards a report stating that this vessel, extensively damaged through stranding, has been temporarily repaired by means of wood planking &c. A number of photographs shewing the damage and progress of repairs are attached.

The vessel is proceeding to an East Coast port ^(Sunderland) for permanent repairs.

As the class is expunged from the Register Book, and the "Stranded & refloated" recorded, it is submitted further action is at present unnecessary, beyond informing the Sunderland Surveyors.
