General Observations and Opinion, a scarp of keel and a scarp of keelson being improperly placed nearly over each other, under the main mast, creating a weakness in the ship at this spot, an iron plate has been introduced on each side of main keelson 1 1/2 thick, 12 in depth, 30 feet long let one inch into the keelson at upper edge and this bolted to each other which materially strengthens the above named weakness affecting cost out at stem, and in keel beam in midship also caulked there, she appears eligible to remain as classed
