Sir

In reply to yours of the 20th inst. and enclosed letters from Messrs Parker & Co and the Acting Superintendent at Tipton - The cables are kept by Mr Green to conform in the same way closely to recognised practice and from Mr Green's remarks I doubt arising respecting them on the score of size of iron - as to the weights of cables although full in the iron once heavy the men say they come up to the weights in Table 22 - but they do not tell the Committee that the length of link is greater than the approximate length for such a size of cable and consequently fewer links and less total weight, however I am not prepared to recommend that the cables be rejected in this case as they are made
