Dear Sirs,

I have to acquaint you that the Committee have had before them a report from the Society's Surveyors at Newcastle on the steamer "TEGUCIGALPA" from which it would appear that some alterations have been effected to the vessel at that port, new boilers fitted and the Special Survey No.1 fully carried out. The Surveyors report that six large cargo doors were tested by hose and the two in No.2 'tween decks were found not quite satisfactory. It was arranged with the Superintendent that upon the steamer's arrival in the United States after leaving Ceiba, S.H., whither she is at present bound, these two doors should be retested and made satisfactory, and I may say that the vessel remains classed subject to this being done. I shall therefore be glad if you will arrange for the case to receive the necessary attention.
