Dear Sir,

I have to report that the defects have not had before then the case of the "MONTFERLAND" together with your report No. 15984, and your remarks on the case have been duly noted. In the circumstances the class has been kept on the condition that the vessel will be eligible for the class if the defects are corrected. In connection with this case it is noteworthy that in all boilers the only evidence was that of broken rivets which in some cases were of little moment. In the case of the "MONTFERLAND" the broken rivet points.

With reference to your letter S. of the 19th instant, respecting the steamer "MONTFERLAND" our report no. 15984, I beg to state that soon as the defects were detected I made enquires of the Owners' Representative if there were no broken rivets reported in former times in way of the defective plates, but they state that none have been reported.

Further I may add that a full report on this case has been forwarded already to Dr. Dorey on the 12th instant as per instructions of the 25th October 1935.

Meanwhile I enclose herewith a copy of this report with photo's etc. on this case for your guidance.
