With reference to the twin screw motor vessel  
Messrs. Cockerill's yard No. 675 we beg to submit for the  
consideration of the Committee a plan shewing the details of the  
keel and centre girder.

It will be observed that, at the request of the Owners,  
a number of manholes are proposed to be cut in the centre girder  
in way of the machinery space.

With the additional girders under the engines in this  
space the strength is doubtless ample with the vessel afloat  
but the case of the vessel in dry dock seems to suggest, in my  
opinion, compensation being fitted.

The plan referred to is being forwarded in triplicate  
under separate cover.
