Dear Mr. Mayne,

I have your letter of the 14th instant informing me that the Ex-German Steamer "KURLAND" has been sold to the Robert Dollar Co. This vessel I hear will be docked at an early date for transfer to the Owners from the Ministry and it is the intention to partly carry through the classification at that time.

The Steamer "BONN" has been sold to Messrs. James Mitchell & Sons of Dundee and was docked on Monday for transfer, and on Sunday night I heard that the B.C. Representative had 'phoned through from ^{Dunblane} ~~Dunblane~~ to Messrs. Menzies & Co., who were docking her that they had been instructed by the new Owners to class this vessel.

The Steamer "COLN" which has been sold to the Jura Steamers Trading Co., has not as far as we can find in this Office been surveyed by us, but from enquiries I have made from the Surveyor for the Ministry and others I am led to understand that the machinery was partially opened up but instructions were then received not to proceed any further with a survey on this vessel.

The S.S. "DESDEMONA" bought by Messrs. James Currie & Co., of this Port will be docked to-morrow for transfer and as arranged ~~at~~ a previous visit that Dr. Montgomerie and myself paid to Mr. Currie, Dr. Montgomerie hopes to be here to ~~visit~~ to inspect the vessel with a view of our classification being assigned to the ship.
