I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 24th instant respecting the case of your Motor Barge "ENIDA", and have to say that the Committee, at their Meeting to-day, have had the question of your application for reinstatement of the vessel's class under consideration.


I may explain that, as already intimated in my letter of the 17th instant, instructions have been given for the vessel's character to be withdrawn from the Register Book and three dots inserted in lieu thereof, and this decision has actually been carried into effect.

In the circumstances, however, I am directed to acquaint you that the Committee will be prepared to reinstate the vessel's class in the Register Book, provided she be generally examined and favourably reported upon by one of the Society's Surveyors. It is concluded that you could arrange for such an examination to be made by the Society's Surveyor at Kingston, Jamaica, and if this is so, I shall have pleasure in cabling to the Surveyor to this effect upon hearing further from you in the matter.
