from Terhaven to Southend.

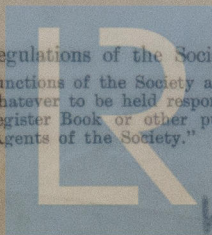
and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's
