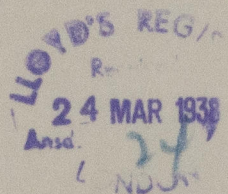

Dear Sir,

s/s "CORABELLA".

We are to-day in receipt of your letter of the 22nd inst., the contents of which cause us - on behalf of the Owners - some difficulty in appreciating the attitude of your Society to these Owners.

In the first case, may we ask you if it is customary for a Principal Surveyor at a port, in conjunction with a Principal Surveyor who has journeyed up from London to that Port to hold a survey, completely ignoring the Owners? Should we not have been advised of the intention to hold this survey, in order to be present and discuss the situation? We consider that it would at least have been courteous to advise us in advance of this survey; we actually heard of it by accident late in the afternoon of the 17th inst. after it had been held and our reason for writing you on that day was in the hope that there might be some explanation.
