Dear Sir,

With reference to my letter of the 15th instant submitting for approval plan of masts for Messrs. Lübecker Maschinenbau Gesellschaft's Yard Nos. 367 and 379 I am now in receipt of a communication from the Builders stating that they are experiencing difficulties in obtaining these masts made of material having an ultimate tensile strength of 41-50 Kgs/mm² as proposed on the plan submitted. In the circumstances the Builders request that the plan submitted might be dealt with on the basis of material having an ultimate tensile strength of 35-44 Kgs/mm², or alternatively if material having an ultimate tensile strength of 41-50 Kgs/mm² is used, the minimum scantlings which could be approved for the masts might be indicated on the plan submitted with my letter of the 15th instant.
