Your remarks regarding the anchors, which have  
not been subjected to the statutory test prescribed in the  
Society's Rules, have been duly noted.

With regard to the case of the "FORT STIKINE",  
we have to confirm that the openings of the 'tween deck  
bulkheads have been efficiently closed, as in the sister ship  
"FORT DOUGLAS", by steel plates rivetted on bulkheads Nos. 19  
and 135 and bolted elsewhere as per approved plans.

We have also to confirm that cement was fitted on  
the bottom in the double bottom tank under the boilers of S.S.  
"KOOTENAY PARK" as in the cases of the sister ships.

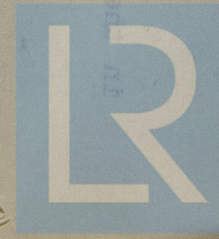
