
Dear Sirs,

S. I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 1st instant with its enclosures relating to the case of your tug "KEVERNE", and to say that your remarks have been carefully noted.

The case has again received the consideration of the Committee at their meeting today who have perused the Report you have been good enough to furnish of the examination made by the Inspector to the National Boiler & General Insurance Co. Ltd., who examined the boiler in June of last year, and I am directed to say that, in this instance, the Committee will be prepared to agree to a further postponement on the understanding that you will arrange for the very much overdue Boiler Survey to be carried out during March, or at latest April.
