E. I am in receipt of your letter of the 17th instant relating to the survey by the Society's Surveyors of a marine boiler, at present lying at Sunderland, built by Messrs. Samuel Hodge & Co., Union Iron Works, Millwall, for Messrs. Crabtree & Co., Yarmouth (Engine No.406) and fitted in 1910 in the drifter "WEST ANGLIA".


In confirmation of my telephone message to you this morning, I have to say that from enquiries made from the Board of Trade it would appear that no plan of the boiler in question is available at their Office, nor have they any record of its construction.

In the circumstances, it will be necessary for the Owners to produce evidence that the material of the boiler is open hearth steel of normal boiler quality, or that the boiler has been built under the supervision of a competent authority; further, for a plan of the boiler to be prepared, the scantlings verified by the Society's Surveyors and the plan submitted to this Office for approval.
