Dear Sir,

M. I duly received your letter of the 14th instant regarding a proposal by the Owners of the Steamers "STEEL AGE", "STEELMAKER" and "STEEL VOYAGER" to join up the poop, bridge and forecastle, and thus make a continuous shelter deck with a tonnage opening, and your remarks have been noted.

With regard thereto I have to state that the scantlings and arrangements of these vessels have been examined and compared with the requirements of the present Rules, and it is found that generally they are such as would permit of the minimum freeboard, on the lines suggested by you, being assigned.

It is presumed that you will see that the pillaring arrangements underneath the new erections are suitably increased.

I have accordingly wired you to-day, as requested, as per copy of translation herewith.

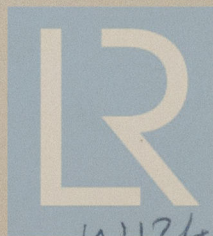
