Dear Sirs,

S. With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of your steamer "RIO QUEQUEN GRANDE", I beg to inform you that I am in receipt of a letter from the Society's Surveyors at Buenos Aires stating that this vessel has left that port without any part of the overdue Special Survey No.3 having been carried out.

With regard thereto I am directed to remind you of the letter of undertaking, furnished by you in October 1934, in which you agreed that, in consideration of the Committee allowing the vessel's classification to remain undisturbed whilst she was laid up, the overdue survey would be carried out before she again proceeded to sea.

The case has been under the consideration of the Committee at their meeting today, and I have to inform you that, in view of the information now received, they have had no alternative but to give instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from the Register Book with a Red Line, indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.
