Dear Sirs,

S. I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of today's date respecting the tarpaulins for the steamer "ESSEQUIBO", which the Society's Surveyors at Southampton recommended to be renewed, and I note that these have already been ordered and are to be delivered to the vessel today.

As regards the renewal of the hatch covers, I have to say that, provided the Society's Surveyors are satisfied in respect of their efficiency for the voyage to Leningrad, the vessel's class will be continued, subject to the covers being dealt with on her arrival at that port.

I have today been in communication with the Society's Surveyors at Southampton by telephone and have explained the position with regard to the above. It is hoped that their report on the case will be received tomorrow, when, if all is reported to be in order, as arranged, with regard to the tarpaulins and hatch covers, I hope to be able to forward you the classification certificates on receipt of the fees and expenses for the survey, an account for which I beg to hand you herewith.
