With reference to Mr. Pearce's telephone call  
respecting the Motorships "A.A. COWAN", "JOSEPH  
NT" and "EKETIAN", I give below details of the surveys  
required in each case for reclassification of these vessels:-

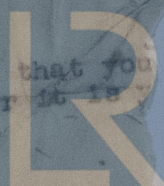
"A.A. COWAN" and "JOSEPH FLINT" - The full  
requirements of Periodical Special Survey (C) of  
the hull will require to be complied with, together  
with a complete Special Survey of the machinery  
and electrical equipment and examination of the  
screw shaft.

I have to inform you that the fee in each of  
these cases, based on the scale for surveys held  
in the U.K., would be a minimum of £32 for the hull,  
£28.10s. for the machinery and £7.10s. for the  
electrical equipment, exclusive of the surveyor's  
expenses. These amounts, however, will require to be  
adjusted to conform to the practice of the port.  
The Survey is held, and an additional fee  
also require to be charged if external repairs  
are carried out.

"EKETIAN" - The requirements for  
above, but in view of the vessel  
Survey fees, based on the U.  
minimum of £54 for the hull, £2  
£4. for the electrical equip  
and above.
