With reference to your letter of the 16th ultimo enclosing Philadelphia first entry report No.2389 on the hull and machinery of the steamer "BRISTOL"-New York Shipbuilding Company's No.169-built to the order of the Coastwise Transportation Company I have to say that I had to visit Philadelphia the other day and took the opportunity of seeing Messrs. Haig and Narbeth in regard to the matter.

The first entry report and plans are returned herewith and I think you will agree that the additions made will allow the case to be submitted for the favorable consideration of the Committee.

A freeboard report has been written and I am arranging for the request form to be signed by the Owners; also for the safetyvalves of the main boilers of the vessel to be adjusted under steam at the first opportunity. In advising the freeboard report and request form, I hope to be able to state when and where the valves can be set. The correspondence forwarded by you is also returned herewith.


