Dear Sir:

In forwarding First Entry reports on S.S. "BRISTOL", New York Shipbuilding Company's No. 169, I have to state for the information of the Committee as follows:-

This vessel was built at New York Shipbuilding Company's Yard to the classification requirements of the American Record.

The construction and scantlings of the hull and machinery was noted from time to time during construction, but no official survey was held.

The boiler steel was tested by the United States Surveyors, also the boilers and steam pipes were tested and safety valves adjusted, as required by the U.S. Government. Records of boiler steel tests attached.

It will be noted the main boiler plan has been approved, but the inside buttstraps in the boiler as built were not increased to 1 7/32 as recommended.

The owners having through the New York office requested classification for this vessel in Lloyd's Register, the First Entry reports and plans are herewith submitted for the favorable consideration of the Committee.
