

We beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of yesterday's date.

On Tuesday last the 8th March, a Mr Hill from your Staff, produced, in a contested Arbitration, a letter dated the 25th August 1920 addressed to your New York House. It is true that Mr Hill attended on Subpoena, issued by the Buyers of Cargo in the Vessel in an Arbitration pending between them and the Sellers of Cargo, for whom we act.

The production of the letter in question by Mr Hill is information beyond what is contained in the Register Book", and was apparently furnished without the written consent of the Owners. Moreover, notwithstanding the Subpoena, it is obvious that information must have been given to enable our Clients Opponents to issue the necessary Subpoena for the production of the letter in question.

In these circumstances we venture to suggest that we are entitled to an explanation why information beyond what is contained in your Register Book has apparently been furnished to others and
