My dear J.F.,

I am obliged for your letter of the 6th instant in regard to the fee of £10 still outstanding in the case of the Steamer "BARRWHIN" and have to-day been in touch with Messrs. Wm. Beardmore & Co. on the subject.

As you are probably aware, Messrs. Beardmore only pay their accounts monthly and accounts rendered in September are paid in December. I have, however, explained to them that while this system is quite satisfactory so far as Steel Testing and such items are concerned, it delays the issue of Classification Certificates in the case of new ships or machinery. They are accordingly taking the matter up with their Finance Department with a view to some alteration being effected.
