Gentlemen,

I have to acquaint you that to complete the boiler survey of the steamer "JUNO", No.484 in the Register Book, partly held at Genoa in August last, the survey of the donkey boiler requires to be held in its entirety. The Owners'

Superintendent recently informed the Genoa Surveyors that this would either be done at Torre Annunziata or when the vessel arrives at Rotterdam at the end of this month to have new boilers fitted.

Nothing has been done in the matter at Torre Annunziata and I have therefore to request that you will attend to the case on the vessel's arrival at Rotterdam and let me know what arrangements are made in the matter.

For your information I may add that the vessel retains her class subject to the holds being sealed and coated, as opportunity offers.
