Dear Sir,

Referring to your letter of the 21st February respecting the fees that would be charged by the Germanischer Lloyd as compared with the Society's scale of fees, and with regard thereto as this information is not publicly published and only given to direct interested parties a copy of the present fees charged by the Germanischer Lloyd, is not obtainable.

All the information that we have been able to obtain is that it is stated that the basis of their fees plus a certain percentage is that which was existance in 1914, the percentage varies with the depreciation in the value of the Mark, all we are informed is that the fees the Germanischer Lloyd charge for German vessel is said to be much less than the Society's scale for German owned vessels, but we do know that for vessels building in Germany for foreign account and survey fees charged to vessel not owned in Germany is that these fees are in no case less than would be charged by the Society for similar services for vessels of similar tonnage and horse power.
