Dear Sirs,

With reference to your first entry report No. 10666 on the s.s. "WAR SUCCOUR" (now named "ASTER") I have to inform you that accounts have been rendered to the Accountant General, Ministry of Shipping, for the fees due for the survey during construction of the Hull and Machinery of this vessel, as under:-

For survey of Hull.....	\$290:18: 8
" " " Machinery....	145: 9: 4
" " " and assignment of freeboard....	8: 8: 0

On payment of these fees your account will be credited with the hull fee, viz:-\$290:18:8, and the freeboard fee of \$8:8:0, in addition to one-quarter of the machinery fee, viz:-\$36:7:4 and one-third of the engine fee, viz:-\$24:5:0, for the completion of the survey of the shafting.

I shall therefore be glad if you will kindly see that the necessary entries are now made in your Rough Fee and Debit Books in the usual way.
