Dear Sirs,

A. With reference to your first entry report No. 17587 on the Steamer "DUNDRUM CASTLE" I have to inform you that the proportion of the fees which will be chargeable to the Department of the Controller General of Merchant Shipbuilding for the survey during construction of this vessel up to the time of transfer to private ownership will be 25% of the difference between the classification fees and the fees as a Standard vessel in the case of the machinery, which will amount to £17. No fee will be chargeable in respect of the hull.

An account has to-day been rendered to the Ministry of Shipping for the above fee, and on payment your account will be credited accordingly. I shall therefore be glad if you will kindly see that the necessary entries are now made in your Rough Fee and Debit Books in the usual way.

In connexion with this case I have to say that it is concluded the thickness of strake next below sheerstrake, clear of bridge, is as approved, but I shall be glad if you will state whether this is so.
