FOUND:

Starboard side Amidships:-

The side of accommodation casing set in and the lining and wood fittings in the rooms displaced and partly broken.

Promenade Deck Starboard Side:-

Six deck planks broken and tie plate bent, seams of adjacent planks started.

RECOMMENDED:

Casing and stiffeners to remove, fair and refit.
Lining and fittings in the rooms to repair and refit.

Six planks and steel tie plate to renew, and adjacent planks to caulk and pay.

The whole of the work to be carried out in an efficient and workmanlike manner together with all incidental removals and replacements, so as to place the vessel in the same condition as before the casualty.
