REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR

Attended at request of Regional Director of Merchant Ship Repairs and examined vessel afloat after damage stated to have been caused by enemy action — the vessel had been set on fire, gutted and subsequently sunk; the steelwork from stem to stern being considerably distorted. A general examination was made of shell, decks, coamings, casing, holds and engine space.

In our opinion, in view of the existing emergency, the carrying out of repairs to enable the vessel to resume trading was worthy of favourable consideration. It carried out at a suitable repairing establishment. The Ministry of War Transport (Liverpool) has now stated that it is not proposed to carry out repairs.
