The s.s. No.2 due 5-23 has been partly held and to complete the same No.3 double bottom tank, the after peak tank and all topside wing tanks require to be scaled and spar ceiling to be placed in order and damage sustained through encountering ice to be dealt with.

The vessel has been laid up at Newport and was stated to have been placed in the hands of the Admiralty Marshall by Mortgagees and was advertised for sale.

The case received the consideration of the Committee the 28th April last when action was deferred for the present.

The Newport Surveyors now report the vessel examined in dry dock and recommendations made for renewals and repairs to shell plating etc., on account of damage through ice and causes not stated.

In the Surveyors' opinion some damaged shell plating and framing on port side amidships should be dealt with before another cargo is loaded.

The special survey has not yet been completed.

The year of grace expired 5-24.

It is submitted action might be deferred, subject to the special survey <sup>being completed</sup> and all necessary repairs carried out before the vessel again proceeds to sea, and Messrs C. H. Killoch & Co. brokers to the Admiralty Marshall be advised accordingly.
