the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of Messrs. Trenton Steel Works Ltd., attend at their Works at Sydney, N.S. on the 14th October and 1st November, 1941, for the purpose of testing and inspecting 4 tail shafts to the order of the War-time Merchant Shipping Ltd., c/o Messrs. Vancouver Engineering Works Ltd., Vancouver, B. C.

The forgings were inspected on completion of rough machining and, so far as could be seen, were sound and free from defects.

Tensile and elongation tests taken from the forgings showed as follows:-

The bend tests proved satisfactory being bent through an angle of 180° without fracture.
