With regard to my wire of the 18th inst.
reading as follows :

"OWNERS WILTON 669 REQUEST SECOND OPINION REPAIR NEW
"CYLINDER WERKSPoor AMSTERDAM IN VIEW SENIORITY
"AMSTERDAM SURVEYOR REQUEST WIRE INSTRUCTIONS OR
"SEND LAING ANTWERP"

and your reply received this morning as follows :

"WERKSPoor CYLINDER LAING BEING INSTRUCTED ATTEND
"AMSTERDAM",

I have to state that the matter arose in December over
a new cylinder made by Messrs. Werkspoor, Amsterdam for
the new steam engine building by them and intended for
Messrs. Wilton-Fyenoord's No. 669 for the Halcyon Lyn,
Rotterdam.

This cylinder has been repaired by Messrs. Werkspoor
for a small defect in the valve chest by means of a
spigot with studded cover to the satisfaction of the
Society's Amsterdam Surveyor. The Owners have, however,
requested a further opinion on the repair, though they
clearly understood that it has been approved subject to
their consent. In order to avoid delay and expense they
prefer to accept the repaired cylinder if they are further
assured, and have requested to have a second opinion from
the Society. I have consequently wired you as above.
