Herewith enclosed we beg to submit for consideration a letter received from Messrs. Harland & Wolff, Ltd., at this Port having reference to the fees charged for the survey of the Auxiliary Engines made by their Finnieston Works for No.616 M.V. "ACCRA", and we shall feel obliged if you will be good enough to advise us in due course whether the Builders should be credited with the amount paid in respect of the survey of the Auxiliary Engines in the account for the survey fees of the main engines.

It will be observed that the Builders are desirous of having the classification certificates issued to them as soon as possible.

The Builders were informed of the arrangements which were made in September 1924 with regard to a similar question in respect of Auxiliary Engines made at Messrs. Allens of Bedford, and intended to be fitted in a motor vessel building



by Messrs. Workman, Clark & Co. Ltd., but they point out that in the present case no travelling is involved in the survey of the machinery as the Surveyor is in constant attendance at their Works.

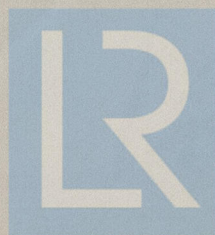
