QUESTION.

ANSWER.

This vessel was blown up in a North French port prior to the 1st May last.

She was a constructive total loss and the hulk has been towed to Falmouth and it is stated that she would be re-built, if possible.

As no further information has come to hand I shall be glad if you will kindly let me know whether this hulk is still at your port, and if so, whether any repairs are being effected to her.

She is lying alongside the Coast Lines jetty here.

The Buoys have been removed and the deck wreckage is being removed.

We understand that the Ministry of Shipping will probably use her as a coal hulk or block ship.
