Surveyed the steamer "ARABY" 4936 tons gross of Liverpool whilst vessel was lying afloat at Victoria Dock, London, on the 14th August, 1940, on account of damage stated to have been caused by collision with steamer "CELTIC STAR" at Freetown, West Africa, and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all <sup>temporary</sup> repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be continued as classed, viz. @ 100 A1 shelter deck with freeboard, subject to indented plates, sheerstrake No. 2 and strake above sheerstrake Nos. 2 & 3 (starboard side) being dealt with at Owners' convenience; also, to indented shell plating port and starboard, and gutter plate in hold (being dealt with. being fit to carry dry and perishable cargo.
