While the vessel is on her way home we are unable to state to which Port she will come but will let you have this information as soon as possible.

This vessel was built in 1928 at the Neptune Yard of Messrs. Swan Hunter & Wigham Richardson Ltd. being their ship No. 1274, and was under your survey during construction so that all particulars of the Ship and various drawings will be in your possession, and we should esteem it a favour if, by reference to these, you could give us an approximation of the effect the application of the International Convention Rules of 1930 will have on this vessel's Freeboard.
