# Lloyd's Register of Shipping.

the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the owners representative attend on board the Steel Sc. "HUMBER ARM" 5758 gross tons register of St. John's, Newfoundland, for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of the damage stated to have been sustained through encountering heavy weather between February 14th and 17th, 1940, on a voyage from New Orleans to Halifax, N. S., loaded.

For further particulars see log books.

On February 19th, 1940, and subsequently, made examination, the vessel lying in the Bedford Basin, N. S., and found 2 port lifeboats destroyed, with part equipment, and 1 davit bent.

It was recommended that the destroyed lifeboats be replaced by two of equal capacity, missing equipment replaced, and davit straightened.

The above repairs were carried out as recommended and found satisfactory.
