The British collier, Marwick Head (496 tons), of Leith, was blown up by a mine off the East Coast early yesterday. Six of the crew of 11 are missing. The rescued men, including the master, are in hospital suffering from shock.

"MARWICK HEAD"

The coasting steamer Marwick Head (496 tons gross) was sunk on Tuesday by a mine off the East Coast and six survivors have been landed at an East Coast port by the trawler Ben Tare. The Marwick Head was owned by A. F. Henry & MacGregor, Ltd., of Leith, who acquired her in 1933, and she was built by Day, Summers & Co., Ltd., Southampton, in 1920, as the Allanwater.
