Dear Sirs,

Freeboard

We are at present treating with owners for a proposed small Shelter Deck steamer 200' x 30' x 13' moulded to main deck. The freeboard of this vessel works out by the tables at $2\frac{1}{2}$ ' from top of beams to centre of disc. Scuppers of the steel plate type riveted to stringer and shell would be fitted and these would have small plate manhole doors for the stringer as usual.

We do not wish to commit ourselves to this freeboard if any new rules have come or are coming into force with regard to the freeboard of small shelter deck vessels with scuppers, and we shall be very much obliged if you will let us know if such a freeboard as above indicated could be assigned, or if it will of necessity be increased on account of the scuppers, and if increased, approximately to what extent.
