TWO GREEK SHIPS FEARED LOST

"Panachrandos" and "Flora"
 According to a British United Press message from Athens, two Greek steamers, the Panachrandos (4661 tons gross) and Flora (2980 tons gross) are considered by Greek shipping authorities to have been lost. Both vessels, it is stated, have not reached their destinations after leaving European ports and no signals have been received from them. There were 31 men on board the Panachrandos, which is owned by Goulandris Bros., of Piraeus, and 25 men in the Flora, owned by Petros M. Nomikos, Ltd., of Piraeus.
