Dear Sir,

S. It is observed from the Shipping Papers that the s.s. "ATLANTEN" is reported to have arrived at your port on the 4th instant. From information which has been received from the Helsingborg Surveyor, it was understood that the vessel would be sold for breaking up purposes, or would be taken to Solvesborg for passing her overdue 3rd Special Survey No.2. As, however, it is observed from a notice that has appeared in the Press that the vessel has been sold to British Buyers under the 'Scrap & Build Scheme', and has now been re-sold to Messrs. John Cashmore of your port, I shall be glad if you will be good enough to ascertain from this firm, at what port the demolition will take place, as the case will be brought to the notice of the Classing Committee on Friday, when following the usual procedure, a notation of 'To be broken up' will be recorded, and the vessel's class automatically cancelled.
