The Owners' Superintendent, attend on board the Twin Sc. "LINNELL", 7424 tons gross of Liverpool on August 17th 1939 and subsequently whilst lying in the Bidston Dock, Birkenhead, with a view to making a general examination of the hull and machinery for the purpose of issuing an Interim Certificate to allow the vessel to proceed to the River Clyde under efficient towing arrangements to be broken up.

The vessel's pumping machinery, auxiliary generators, compressors and circulating pumps were examined under working conditions and the bilges in the holds and engine room were satisfactorily pumped out. The windlass and steering gear were also tried under working conditions and found satisfactory.

In our opinion the vessel, so far as now seen, is in an efficient condition to be towed to the River Clyde, provided efficient towing arrangements are made.
