the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Owners' Representatives, Messrs Gineste & Co., Marseilles, attend on board the Motorship "CABO SANTO TOMÉ", 12,589 tons gross, N^o. 72262 in the Register Book, whilst lying afloat at Moie "G", Marseilles, on the 10th October, 1936, for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of the damage stated to have been sustained through heavy weather whilst moored in the Marseilles docks during the night of the 7th/8th October, 1936.

For further particulars please refer to the log-books.

The shellplating and framing on the starboard side of No 2 hold were examined, as far as practicable, internally and externally, and the following damage was found:-

SHELL.- (Plates numbered from forward)

5th strake below main sheer:-

N^o 5 plate set in deeply.
N^o 6 plate indented at lower edge.

6th strake below main sheer:-

After end of N^o 6 plate and fore end of N^o 7 plate set in deeply.
N^o 8 plate indented at upper edge.

Shellplating leaking slightly in way of disturbed riveting and caulking.
